CALL TO ORDER

Chair Hall called to order the regular session of the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners.

ROLL CALL - ESTABLISHMENT OF A QUORUM

Present at the meeting were Chair Hall and Commissioner Jacobson, Commissioner Hunt is excused; a quorum was established.

ADOPTION OF CONSENT CALENDAR

Chair Hall introduced the Consent Calendar and the items were reviewed.

Commissioner Jacobson moved to adopt the consent calendar as presented and Commissioner Hall seconded; a vote was taken and passed unanimously.

DECISION/ACTION

A. Order #3-22-91 Amending Masks in Lincoln County Facilities and Property

Chair Hall requested the COVID/Vaccination Update prior to this decision item.

County Counsel Kristin Yuille presented on the current order in place and the updated state mask mandate. The county has been following the State's guidance on the mask mandate and this is a consideration to follow their guidance and lift the county mask mandate.

Lincoln County Sherriff Curtis Landers reported that the sheriff's office is still discussing the mask requirements in the Jail and waiting on guidance from OSHA. They are looking at still requiring N95 masks in their COVID unit and in the booking area. In the housing area where everyone has been tested, they are looking at removing the mask requirement. He reported that he spoke with Judge Bachart and they do not plan on requiring masks in the courtroom if the mandate is lifted.

Commissioner Jacobson asked for clarification on amending the order before the sheriff's office has made their final decisions. Counsel Yuille informed that the jail, health care, and transit will fall under their own requirements.

Commissioner Jacobson moved to amend the current mask mandate with the exception of the secure area of the Lincoln County Jail, Health and Human Services health care settings, and Lincoln County Transit. Commissioner Hall seconded; a vote was taken and passed unanimously.

DISCUSSION/INFORMATION (Note the Board could act on the following topics)

A. Tanabe/Grant Ocean Shores Permit and Declaration

Public Works Director Roy Kinion presented the permit and declaration to address shoreline erosion along the Lincoln Beach area. There is 5-foot-wide public beach access adjacent to the Tanabe and the

Grant properties. They are asking for a permit and declaration approving them to riprap and maintain that public beach access. Kinion presented maps and photos of the identified area.

Commissioners shared comments and asked questions regarding the permit and declaration process. A decision was made to revisit this item at the next meeting.

REPORTS

A. COVID/Vaccination Update

Health and Human Services Director Jayne Romero provided the weekly update on COVID-19 cases and vaccinations.

Commissioners shared comments and questions regarding COVID and Director Romero's presentation.

Director Romero asked Commissioners if they would like the weekly COVID reports to continue or if the frequency should change. Commissioner Jacobson suggested that she would like to hear from the public input on the usefulness of the updates.

B. Lincoln County Veterans Services Office

Veterans Services Officer Keith Barnes introduced the office staff and presented updates on the Lincoln County Veterans Service Office resources, goals, and projects.

Commissioners shared questions, comments, and thanked Keith and his team for their work in the county.

C. Commissioners

Commissioner Hall shared a statement in response to constituent contact concerning Ballot Measure 21-203.

Commissioner Jacobson updated that the tiny home villages in North Lincoln County have been approved and that the county is looking for an organization to run those projects. She updated that there are now disaster case managers available for all wildfire survivors. There were previous issues with calling 411 but that issue has been fixed and is working properly. There are also people at the Salmon River Grange to help with the process.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Chair Hall called for public input.

Written public input received since the last meeting was reviewed.

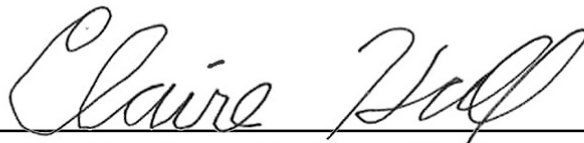
ADJOURNMENT

The next Board of Commissioners meeting will be held virtually on March 16, 2022, at 10:00 a.m.

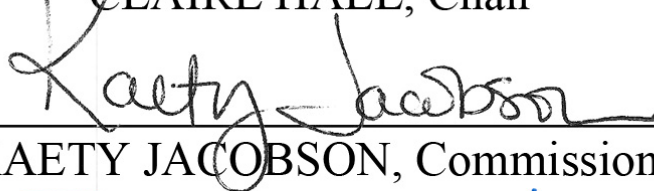
The meeting adjourned at 11:03 a.m.

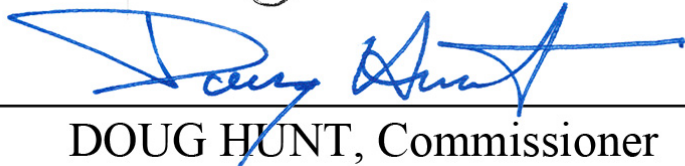
