CALL TO ORDER

Commissioner Hunt called to order the regular meeting of the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners.

ROLL CALL – ESTABLISHMENT OF A QUORUM

Present at the meeting were Commissioner Hunt, Commissioner Hall, and Commissioner Jacobson.

ADOPTION OF THE CONSENT CALENDAR

Commissioner Hunt introduced the Consent Calendar. A motion was made by Commissioner Hall to approve the consent calendar as presented. Commissioner Jacobson seconded. A vote was taken and passed unanimously.

PUBLIC HEARING

Jerry Herbage requested that the reading of Case File 01-ZC-PC-20 be postponed for purposes of curing procedural issues.

Commissioner Hall made a motion to remand Case File number 01-ZC-PC-20, to the planning commission for purposes of curing procedural issues. Commissioner Jacobson seconded. A vote was taken and passed unanimously.

REPORTS

1. Lincoln County Public Health COVID-19 Update – Presented by Florence Pourtal, Public Health Deputy Director

Florence Pourtal reported Lincoln County is seeing a decrease in cases being reported in the past few weeks. There were 50 cases for the month of March and seven outbreaks.

Commissioner Hunt asked whether they would be moved to the moderate level, or they would get a two-week reprieve.

Director Pourtal clarified that they will be granted a two-week cautionary period, which she believes the reason for this is to see whether the case numbers will come back down or maintain the trend upward.

Director Pourtal reported Lincoln County is number 3 in the State for vaccinations with almost 15,000 people being vaccinated. Director Pourtal clarified those vaccines are prioritized this week for adults aged 45-64 with one or more underlying health conditions as well as migrant and seasonal farm workers.

Director Pourtal listed cancer, kidney disease, COPD, Down's Syndrome, heart conditions such as heart failure, coronary artery disease, or cardiomyopathy, immunocompromised state from solid organ transplant or HIV, obesity with a BMI greater than or equal to 30 kilos per square meters, pregnancy, sickle cell disease, and type 2 diabetes as underlying health conditions.

2. Echo Mountain Complex Fire Update

County Counsel Wayne Belmont presented that they are finalizing on the information they're getting on the municipal wildfire assistance grant that they received and getting programs underway there. This covers both this fiscal year and a promise to cover next fiscal year for particular activities. A legislative funding bill will give the county another round of funding, though it is not sure when the money will be coming, but it should happen this fiscal year.

Roy Kinion, Public Works Director, provided update on the Echo Mountain cleanup. There is still a big push to get ROEs (rights of entry) so that cleanup can continue. Progress is consistent and they are heading the right direction.

3. Commissioners

Commissioner Jacobson made an update on the funding to be received for the private well testing program and funding for damaged public access roads.

Commissioner Jacobson reported attending recent Division of Land Conservation and Development meetings. The County hopes to receive funding from the State to contract or hire help for the Planning Department to assist the wildfire affected communities.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Commissioner Hunt presented a few public comments since the last meeting.

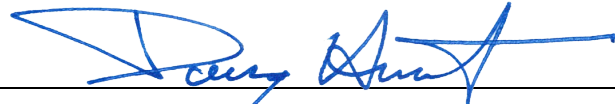
ADJOURNMENT

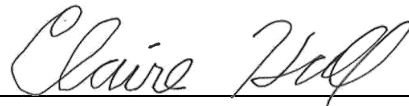
